
Year 2 Homework Week ending 29.2.20



Dear Parents and Carers,

This week in English we've looked at a new genre: book reviews. We started our unit looking at examples of book reviews, deciding what a good what looks like (WAGOLL). These were features we decided to include: A title, subheadings, conjunctions (but, so, because etc) and a range of punctuation. (This could include any/all of the Year 2 punctuation such as commas in lists, question and exclamation marks and apostrophes for contractions — can't and for singular possession — David Walliams's book.) We read, 'There's a Snake in my School" by David Walliams, and wrote reviews on it.

We have continued our learning on time, telling the time to quarter to and five minutes on an analogue clock. Playing lots of games has helped develop and reinforce our skills. We've also answered problems such as: I start reading at five o'clock. I read for twenty-five minutes. What time do I finish?

For a child to be Year Two expected (age related) they have to be able to tell the time to quarter of the hour. For a child to be greater depth, they need to tell the time to five minutes.
