Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you and your families are all safe and well. It has certainly been a very strange couple of weeks for us all coping with new and unusual changes to our daily lives. Thankfully, the weather has been kind, allowing us to get outside into the garden.

Although different, many parents/carers have informed us that they have started to settle into new routines at home with their children and that key to having a successful day has been to have structured routines and time set aside for exercise, learning and relaxation throughout the day. It is important to remember that during a typical school day, your child's teacher splits their time between up to 30 pupils, whereas at home, they have your undivided attention, and fewer distractions. In this one-to-one situation, far more learning can take place in half an hour than could possibly be achieved in a busy classroom at school – even if you're not an expert home educator. Ultimately you know your child best and can recognise when it is the best time to build in learning time but do try to ensure that your child is reading every day.

School has remained open (even during the Easter holidays) since the beginning of the lockdown to care for the children of our Key Worker families. A massive thank you for all that our Key Worker parents/carers are doing for us during this pandemic. The children of our Key Worker families have coped remarkably well in school and have adjusted to being in school where the provision is quite different. For the children and the staff (who are working on a rota system) it is very peculiar being in school and we miss the lovely buzz and interactions that we have normally in school. We do miss you all!

Today marks the beginning of the summer term at school and with another three weeks of lockdown ahead of us I wanted to let you know how we will continue to communicate and set home learning tasks over the coming weeks.

Home Learning

Our home learning for each year group will be placed on our school website www.blackhorsehillinfant.co.uk under the section Coronavirus Home Learning Tab. The teachers have placed an overview of the learning that is planned for the summer term on there so you can see the topics and areas that were planned to be covered this term in each area of the curriculum.

In addition, the teaching staff will add learning in two week blocks for the children. Learning will be posted on the website today and then again on Monday 4th May. The home learning will include reading, writing, phonics, maths, science and ideas to complete for the wider curriculum such as geography, history and computing. Teachers have also added a project which may take you longer than the two weeks to complete. We have tried to offer a range of learning opportunities because

we understand that not every family will be able to print off worksheets. Do remember to access your child's Bug Club account as new texts will be allocated.

Please do not let having no paper, exercise books or writing materials be a barrier to completing home learning. We have a small stock in school which we can provide to families who are struggling with this aspect of home learning. We may even be able to loan iPads to families who have no technology to access Bug Club etc. Contact school via the school office email schooloffice@blackhorsehill-infant.wirral.sch.uk if we can be of any assistance.

Reports and Communication

As you know, our Parent/Teacher meetings had to be cancelled because of the Covid-19 outbreak. Free School Meals

Families who are on the Free School Meals Register have been supported by school, the Local Authority and from today, the government. Supermarket vouchers have been issued which families can use to purchase food.

We are mindful that due to the current situation many families may have experienced a change in their financial circumstances and that their children may now be eligible for the free school meals vouchers.

A lot of our children are already registered on the online free school meals system and so any change in circumstances will be automatically picked up. Statutory Assessments

Formal assessments for this year have been cancelled by the government. This means that our Year 2 children will not complete Statutory Assessment Tests (SATs), Yr1 pupils will not complete the phonic screening test and our Foundation 2 pupils will not be assessed against the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile. Primary School performance measures will not be published for the year 2019/20.

Finally, the past few weeks have been quite challenging for us all and we have had to get used to new ways of working both at home and at school but I have been impressed by the way that our whole school community have worked together to remain positive and make the best of the difficult situation.
