Guidance to support pupils and families during a school closure

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1. Introduction

This booklet will provide parents and carers with guidance on how to support children at home during a school closure. Please note that the procedures outlined in this guide will begin on Monday 20th April 2020 until the school is instructed to reopen for all pupils. We appreciate that each family's own circumstances will influence the nature of any time away from school and it will be the parents and carers best judgements as to the amount of work the children complete.

2. Home Learning Foundation 1 to Year 2

You have already received a home learning pack on Friday 20th March when school closed.

As of Monday 20th April all home learning will be available on the school website.

During the school closure, your child's class teacher will plan learning in blocks of two weeks. There will also be a project that will take longer than two weeks. All learning will be accessible on the Home Learning pages via the Google Drive.


