Terms of Reference - Learning and Achievement Committee

Membership	<p>a) The committee shall consist of not less than four named governors plus the Headteacher (if not a governor) or his/her representative if the Governing Body agree to such an invitation.</p> <p>b) The committee shall have such co-opted non-voting members as decided by the governing body. The committee may make recommendations for these appointments.</p>
Quorum	The quorum shall be three governors plus the Headteacher.
Meetings	The committee shall meet once per term and otherwise as required.
Terms of Reference	<p>1) To offer a standing invitation to any members of the Governing Body to attend Learning and Achievement Committee meetings as their interests determine.</p> <p>2) To consider school policy on any matters relating to the school curriculum: to recommend new policy and any amendments to existing policies to the Governing Body.</p> <p>3) To receive reports from the Headteacher or appropriate member of staff on any matters relating to the organisation and content of the school curriculum.</p> <p>4) To ensure that the curriculum policies meet the needs of all pupils and that where necessary equipment and resources are modified for pupils' needs: This would be in relation to: SEND Code of Practice (2014) Equality Act 2010</p> <p>5) To review the Equality Policy and Accessibility Plan.</p> <p>6) To consider any local or national reports affecting the curriculum, identifying any implications for school policy and practice.</p> <p>7) To review the information about school performance required to be published.</p> <p>8) To monitor the progress of SEND and Pupil Premium children</p> <p>9) To hold the school to account for the impact of Pupil Premium Funding on outcomes for pupils.</p> <p>10) To make recommendations to the Finance and Personnel Committee on resource levels for curriculum implementation.</p> <p>11) To recommend to the full Governing Body for approval statutory targets for pupils' performance.</p> <p>12) Governors should try to see the school in action at least once a year especially the English, Mathematics, Computing and SEND Governors.</p>
