This week we have been very busy using a range of different materials to make 3D towers and dragons. In Maths we have learnt the difference between a 2D and 3D shape; many children can now describe the properties of a cone, cylinder, cube and cuboid. Additionally, most children are able to select a particular named shape. In English we have learnt new graphemes, practised blending, writing words and sentences. Lots of children have learnt new vocabulary from the story of Zog by Julia Donaldson. For example: expert, soared, idea, gleaming, implore, fearsome, trusty and crew.

Activities to complete at home:

- Please read your online book and practise spotting the graphemes highlighted at the front of the books in words. Remember to write a comment in your child's reading diary and bring the diary in each day to ensure that your book is renewed and the teacher can inform you about your child's weekly reading target. If possible the children need to be completing daily reads at home in order to reinforce the graphemes, fluency and their comprehension skills.
- Go on a 3D shape hunt around your home. How many cylinders, cones, cubes and cuboids can you spot?
- Have a go at writing a few simple words in your homework book. E.g. dog, cat, hen, bug. Challenge: Can you write these words as part of a sentence? E.g. The dog sat on a rug.
