<u>Year 1 Homework</u> Week ending 15th December



Dear Parents and Carers,

This week in English, we received a letter from Rapunzel telling us how a dangerous dragon had escaped in the town of 'Once Upon a Time'. The children quickly got to work on a plan and then created instructions for how to catch it. The children worked hard to remember capital letters, finger spaces and punctuation. They have also shown how amazing their writing is by including imperative (bossy) verbs and adjectives.

In Maths, we have been learning about shape. We have learned to recognise common 2-D and 3-D shapes. After we then sorted the shapes based upon a range of different features such as shape, colour, whether it can stack or cannot (3-D only) and many more. We then applied this to different patterns of shapes and worked out the shapes that would come next.

In Geography, the children have learnt about physical and human features. Physical features are things that have always been there or naturally made, such; hill, mountain, river, flatland. A human feature is something that has been built by humans to change the landscape. For example, school, church, shop.
