Wellies

We go in the outdoors in any weather! As the weather is changing it can often be wet and muddy outside. Please can you send in a named pair of wellies that can be kept under your child's peg. You may also like to send in a named Puddle Suit too that we can keep in your child's spare clothes bag.

Spare Clothes

Sometimes your child may get a little wet or dirty during one of their learning activities. While we do have some spare clothes in school, most children prefer to get changed into their own clothes. Please can you send in some spare clothes (it doesn't have to be school uniform) including socks and underwear that can be kept in a bag on their peg.

Toileting

While we are always here to help your child when going to the toilet, we are also encouraging them to become more independent in their personal hygiene. Please can you encourage your child when they are at home to 'have a go' when wiping before they ask for a grown-ups help.

Naming items and Clothing

It is really helpful if all items of clothing are named. It is amazing how some children can identify their jumper from the perfume of their washing powder but names really help to save time!

Due to the current circumstances clearly labelled water bottles would be fantastic too. We have a number of children that have the same water bottles and we really do not want children drinking from another child's bottle.

Lunchboxes

Please can we remind parents that if you provide your children with grapes that they are cut in half lengthways as some whole grapes can be a choking hazard.
