After a busy eight week start to the school year both the children and staff were ready for a bit of rest and recuperation in the half-term holidays. I hope you managed to have some relaxation time too!

Our school community has adjusted to the changes that we have had to make due to Covid-19 and routines are running smoothly with minimal disruption to the children and their education. Many of the measures will continue this half-term with the exception that our Year 2 children will now move to eating their lunch in the hall which will enable the teaching staff to set up the classrooms for afternoon lessons.

Fortunately, we did not have to isolate any class bubbles last half-term and thankfully we had no positive cases amongst our school staff. Individual children have had to isolate and we have responded as quickly as possible to provide remote learning provision for these pupils. To support remote learning we have trialled sending homework on Tapestry (EYFS pupils) and See-Saw (KS1 pupils). We are grateful that you have embraced these new approaches and practised sending examples of your children's work back to the teachers.

If there are any changes to how schools will operate following the government announcement on Saturday about a second national lockdown I will write to you.

The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal

Another charity we will be supporting this half-term will be the Royal British legion. As is customary I will share with the children in our assembly the importance and significance of the poppy.

Each class will have their own selection of poppy-related items that they will sell as the children arrive in the morning. We will be asking for a donation for traditional paper poppies but there is a suggested cost for other items such as the snap band (£1.50), reflector poppy (50p), silicon wristband (50p) and zip pull (50p). These will be sold on a first come first served basis.

Poppies and related items will be on sale from Wednesday 4th November until Friday 6th November.
