School bags



With funds raised by FOBHHS we have now bought new up to date HPRBs. These books were expensive so please look after them and ensure that they are returned to school. If books are not returned to school, staff will not issue new books to children. They are a costly resource and we don't have the funds to replace them.

Statutory Assessment of Pupils in Year 1 and 2

<u>Year 1</u>

Many of you will already know from attending our curriculum evenings in September that the Government require all Year 1 children to sit a statutory phonic screening check. The screening this year will take place during the week commencing 11th June 2018. Children who are now in Year 2 and did not meet the expected standard in Year 1 will re-take the assessment in this week too.

The screening check is designed to confirm whether children have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. Our children are familiar with such phonic assessments so this should not cause any distress. The screening sessions will take place on a one to one basis with a class teacher. Parents/carers will receive the results in the end of year report.

Leading up to the phonic screening check the Year 1 staff will be sending out homework and games related to phonics. It would really help your child if these activities are completed.

<u>Year 2</u>

During May, assessment tests will be administered to Year 2 pupils. The test will be incorporated into normal classroom practice so we hope the children will be unaware that the assessments are taking place. We would be grateful if parents/carers also do not focus too much of their child's attention on these assessments because they form only a small part of the child's assessment profile. Once completed our teachers will use the Key Stage 1 test results to help them to reach an overall judgement of the standards children have reached in English Reading, English Writing and Mathematics. You will also receive a teacher assessment judgement for Science, but there is no science test. You will receive this information in your child's end of year report. New information leaflets and videos have been produced for parents/ carers by the Standards and Testing Agency. I will send out a copy of the leaflet to parents/carers of children in Year 2.
