As readers we will:  Handle the book the right way up and hold it carefully to turn the pages.  Choose the books we want to look at ourselves  Enjoy listening to different stories.  Read two Finding Stories- The Something and Star in the Jar  Within phonics we will:  Link sounds to letters of the alphabet.  Hear and say initial sounds in words.  Follow letters and sounds phase 2 sets of letters:  - s,a,t,p  - i,n,m,d  - g,o,c,k  - ck,e,u,r  - h,b,f,ff,l,ll,ss  We will also learn the tricky words: the, to, no, go, I and into  Follow letters and sounds phase 3 sets of letters:  Set 6: j, v, w, x  Set 7: y, z, zz, qu	As writers we will:  Give meaning to the marks we make in different media such as chalk, paint, pencil, sand, shaving foam, felt pens and crayons.  Use phase 2 graphemes to write clearly identifiable letters and begin to write CVC words such as sat, pat, map, pin, cat etc  Listen to the initial sounds in words to be able to:  Label pictures  Create lists  Write our names  Work towards writing captions	As mathematicians we will:  Learn to recognise the numerals 0-5 and the value of numbers to 5  Use a range of materials to sort and count  Use five and ten frames when counting objects  Compare groups of objects  Match the numerals to the correct quantity.  Begin to use the language of one more, one less  Shape  Also as mathematicians we will:  show an interest in shape and space by playing with large blocks  begin to use mathematical names and correct vocabulary to talk about 2D shapes  order items by length or height  begin to use language relating to money;  sequence and order simple events  begin to use the vocabulary of time	To gain strength in our hands we will:  Enjoy different funky finger activities such as threading, mark making, using tweezers and balancing activities.  Show a preference for a dominant hand.  Begin to form recognisable letters  Draw lines and circles using gross motor movements.  Use gross motor muscles during singing and dancing  We will continue to build our physical development skills during PE sessions.
