Step 1: Eco-Committee

	Pupils are given the opportunity to invite along non-teaching staff to join their meetings.	
	There is representation from parents or governing body on your Eco-Committee.	
	Your Eco-Committee meet at least once every half term.	
	Pupils share responsibility with adults for running meetings and keeping a record of the meetings.	
	Minutes of Eco-Committee meetings are displayed on your Eco-Board for others to see.	
	Your Eco-Committee ensures there is communication from and to the whole of the school.
