### **Newsletter July 2021**

Well, it has certainly been another challenging year for us all, with constantly changing rules and regulations relating to Covid. We have, however, pulled together as a school community to overcome the issues and barriers that we have faced, to ensure our children continue to feel happy, safe and confident to learn. Thank you for supporting us and being tolerant and patient as we have found our way with lockdown two, remote learning, self-isolation, bubbles popping, staggered starts etc.

It seems an opportune moment to express my gratitude to our school staff for their hard work over the year. The teaching and support staff have worked relentlessly, often having to find different ways of working to keep disruption to a minimum and reduce the impact of Covid on the children's learning. I feel very lucky to work with such a committed and conscientious staff.

Working behind the scenes our governing body have also faced different challenges perhaps the most significant is meeting virtually! They have been invaluable over the past year providing sound advice and reassurance. I would like to express my gratitude to them.

Apologies for making the newsletter sound like a speech from the Oscars but it has been a difficult time for us all and I want all our school community stakeholders to understand that their work and partnership is valued.

### **September 2021**

At the time of writing there has been some further guidance from the government which sets out a range of measures so I will now communicate what this means for our school for September.

There is hope that with Step 4 of the government guidance school life will be able to return to some normality in September and we will be able to have whole school assemblies, school trips and lunchtime in the hall for all classes. Thankfully, the bubble system will end too.

It appears that the wearing of face masks will be optional later this month and this is the advice that we will be giving to parents/carers/grandparents when they drop off and collect children from school in September. In addition, the one way system will end.

However, I am proposing that for the first few weeks that the staggered start and finish times for each class remain in place whilst we adjust to the new school year. We will review this after the first four weeks.

Many of our children have been inspired to litter pick on the way to school too!




The children have also produced some fabulous leaflets which local businesses have agreed to display. Look out for them!
