Dear Parents and Carers,

Excitingly, we received a letter from Grandad in the story Grandad's Island by Benji Davies, which included a non-chronological report that he had written about toucans. He asked us if we would be able to write reports for some of the other animals that are in the rainforest with him. Throughout the week, we've developed our understanding of the appropriate layout and language features for a non-chronological report. We've researched facts about an animal from the rainforest (tigers - 2TM and orangutans 2CY).

In Maths, we have been learning to tell the time. We recapped telling the time to the hour and half past the hour and spent significant time explaining how we know e.g. "I know that is it half past 5 because the hour hand is in the middle of 5 and 6 and the minute handing is pointing to the 6". We also have taught the children to tell the time to quarter past and quarter to the hour. Whilst many children were able to remember where the minute hand needed to pointed, some of us needed to be more careful with where we positioned the hour hand e.g. for quarter to 7 we had to put the hour hand just before the 7, not on it or in the middle of 6 and 7. When it came to drawing hands on clocks, many of us found it tricky to remember to ensure that the minute hand is longer so we will continue to focus on this during our morning activity slots at 8.40.


