Dear Parents and Carers,
Our new unit in English is diary writing, incorporating our History learning on the Great Fire of London. Having related our previous work on recounts to diary writing, we're including these key skills: conjunctions and past tense verbs. We have also begun learning about exclamation sentences. These start with "How" or "What" and end in a verb followed by the exclamation mark. Eg. What an awful fire it was! How shocked I am!

In Maths, we've continued our learning on addition and subtraction. This week, we have focused on adding two 2 digit numbers that don't bridge through ten. Examples of this are: $47+12$ and $53+35$. We started off using dienes to make the numbers. We have stressed that for addition, we start with the greatest number as this is more efficient; we add the ones first and then the 10 s. During our learning we have noticed that some children are finding adding a 1-digit number to a 1-digit number difficult so continuing to practise quick fire number bonds at home within 20 would really help.


On Friday $15^{\text {th }}$ November, Year 2 will be raising money for Children in Need. To help raise money, there will be a cake sale in the hall after school.
