It has been lovely to welcome back Mrs Honeybourne to F1 this week. Mrs Honeybourne has enjoyed getting to know the children. The children have enjoyed having another adult in the classroom to support them in their learning.

This week we have been reading lots of different versions of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'.

The children have been undertaking lots of different learning opportunities. They have been building bridges in the outdoors to help the goats to cross the river. They have been developing their mark making skills by drawing their own Trolls, decorated Troll biscuits and created bridges from recycled materials!

We have had some amazing role play in the small world too with fantastic character voices!

As part of our Curriculum Maestro topic 'How does that building stay up?' The children looked at lots of different bridges around the British Isles and talked about the materials that they were made of. We also discussed whether the bridges were for people to travel across, trains, cars, trucks or boats. We used vocabulary such as metal, steel, aqueduct, stone, brick, strong, arch, concrete and structure. We also watch a time-lapse video clip of a bridge being built!
